 - (A) PURSUANT TO SECTION 2074.2 OF THE FISH AND GAME CODE, CONSIDERATION OF THE DEPARTMENT'S REVIEW AND RECOMMENDATION, AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON THE PETITION TO LIST BLACK-BACKED WOODPECKER AS A THREATENED SPECIES UNDER THE CALIFORNIA ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT. (Note: The Department's Initial Evaluation Report on the Petition was received at the March 2011 meeting and made available for public review. At the November 2011 meeting, the Department again summarized its Initial Evaluation Report and discussed the supplemental information submitted through August 3, 2011. The Commission voted to continue this item to its December meeting, so that petitioner submittals dated November 10 and 11, 2011 could be evaluated.)

BAYLIS, HEREBY FINDS THAT THE PETITION TO LIST THE BLACK-BACKED WOODPECKER AS A THREATENED OR ENDANGERED SPECIES CONTAINS SUFFICIENT INFORMATION TO INDICATE THAT THE PETITIONED ACTION MAY BE WARRANTED AND DECLARES THE BLACK-BACKED WOODPECKER A CANDIDATE SPECIES, AND DIRECTS THE DEPARTMENT TO PROMPTLY COMMENCE A STATUS REVIEW OF THE SPECIES AND REPORT BACK TO THE COMMISSION WITHIN ONE YEAR FROM THE DATE OF THE COMMISSION'S PUBLISHED FINDINGS WITH A RECOMMENDATION AS TO WHETHER THE SPECIES SHOULD OR SHOULD NOT BE LISTED AS ENDANGERED OR THREATENED.
