RE: DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION CONCERNING THE GRAY WOLF

On behalf of the Fourth Senate District, I am writing to convey my opposition and dismay to the listing of the Gray Wolf (*Canis lupus*) as a threatened or endangered species in the Fish and Game Code Sections 2075 and 2075.5.

The federal government is considering a delisting of this species under the Endangered Species Act. This is due to its burgeoning population and natural expansion.

California does not need another layer of wildlife management restrictions for a species that recently has been an occasional visitor to our state. The wolf identified as OR7 is part of a much larger healthy wolf population with territory currently primarily located in Oregon.

The added regulatory burden that would be imposed on farmers and ranchers in the North State as a result of such a listing poses a legitimate threat to livestock, private property rights and the agricultural-based economy.

For these reasons, I urge the Commission to reconsider its action to add the Gray Wolf to the state's list of threatened or endangered species.
