



Resolution of the California Ocean Protection Council regarding the California Collaborative Approach: Marine Protected Areas Partnership Plan

December 2, 2014

WHEREAS, California's Marine Protected Area (MPA) network was designed, designated and implemented using an inclusive approach that involved a broad constituency to shape and define the statewide network; and,

WHEREAS, California is continuing to embrace partnerships as a key element to the effective long-term management of the MPA network; and,

WHEREAS, California has identified an effectively managed statewide network of MPAs as a key management tool for supporting the natural diversity and abundance of marine life and increasing the resilience of ecosystems against impacts such as climate change; and,

WHEREAS, California has played a long-standing leadership role in innovative approaches to coastal and ocean conservation and management which is exemplified by the continued development of partnerships with Californians to manage the MPA network; and,

WHEREAS, the Ocean Protection Council's Strategic Plan 2012 – 2017 identifies as a priority working with partners to effectively advance MPA management, enforcement, monitoring, education and outreach across a broad range of public and private entities that are engaged in marine resource protection and restoration activities; and,

WHEREAS, the Natural Resources Agency (CNRA) led by the Ocean Protection Council (OPC), together with the Ocean Science Trust, the California, the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) and the California Fish and Game Commission (FGC) have developed a novel collaborative approach to managing California's marine protected areas (MPAs) described in the California Collaborative Approach: Marine Protected Areas Partnership Plan (Partnership Plan); and,

WHEREAS, the Partnership Plan establishes a network of state-wide "Community Collaboratives" which connect the core state agencies to the various local groups and stakeholders interested and engaged in supporting and informing MPA management decisions; and,

WHEREAS, the Partnership Plan offers California tribes a suite of options and contacts for engaging in communication and collaboration with the state on MPA management and more broadly on issues related to ocean health; and,

WHEREAS, the Partnership Plan connects local and federal efforts with state management and includes a dispute resolution mechanism to encourage the resolution of issues quickly and efficiently among partners; and,

WHEREAS, the Partnership Plan emphasizes using science to inform decision making and improving the integration of tribal ecological knowledge and knowledge of fishermen into the MPA management process;

That OPC staff will continue to manage and update an internal work plan with core partner state agencies to explicitly assign roles and responsibilities including identifying specific actions to ensure implementation of the Partnership Plan
