Background

FGC staff has prepared a list of legislative bills (Exhibit 1) that may be of interest to FGC, which includes a brief synopsis and current bill status. Items highlighted in yellow indicate legislation of particular interest or that may impact FGC's resources and workload.

This is an opportunity for FGC to provide direction to staff concerning any proposed legislation. At any meeting, FGC may direct staff to provide information to or share concerns with bill authors. FGC members also have the option to take positions on bills at the same meeting an update is provided.

The Legislature recessed on Aug 31. As the 2016 session nears adjournment, there are some important deadlines to note: Sep 30 was the last day for the Governor to sign or veto bill passed by the legislature, Nov 8 is the General Election, and Nov 30 is when the legislature is scheduled to adjourn.

Updates on relevant legislation (for complete list see Exhibit 1)**1. Legislation signed by the Governor**

- ✓ **AB 2549 (Water, Parks and Wildlife)** – Extends the procedures outlined in CESA indefinitely, extends the authority to DFW concerning dreissenid mussels to Jan 2020, and other provisions.
- ✓ **ACR 148 (Chau) – Law Revision Commission** – Grants approval to the Law Revision Commission (LRC) to continue its study of designated topics that the Legislature previously authorized or directed it to study, and authorizes LRC to study, report on, and prepare recommended legislation as soon as possible concerning the revision of the portions of the Government Code relating to public records that would accomplish specified goals including, among other things, reducing the length and complexity of current sections and clearly expressing legislative intent without any change in the substantive provisions.
- ✓ **SB 122 (Jackson) – CEQA: record of proceedings** – (1) Requires the lead agency, at the request of a project applicant and consent of the lead agency, to prepare a record of proceedings concurrently with the preparation of a negative declaration, mitigated negative declaration, EIR, or other environmental document for projects; (2) Requires a lead agency to submit to the State Clearinghouse those environmental documents in either a hard-copy or electronic form as prescribed by the office; and, (3) Requires the

office to establish and maintain a database for the collection, storage, retrieval, and dissemination of environmental documents and notices prepared pursuant to CEQA and to make the database available online to the public.

- ✓ **SB 1089 (Pavley) – Wildlife Conservation Board** – Expands the composition of the board to include 4 public members to serve terms of 4 years each and would require one public member to be appointed by the Speaker of the Assembly, one public member to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules, and 2 public members to be appointed by the Governor, and requires the public members have demonstrated interest and expertise in land acquisition for conservation purposes.
- ✓ **SB 1235 (DeLeon) – Ammunition** – If the Safety for All Act of 2016 is enacted by voters, amends the act to instead allow ammunition to be sold only to a person whose information matches an entry in the Automated Firearms System and who is eligible to possess ammunition, to a person who has a current certificate of eligibility issued by the department, or to a person who purchases or transfers the ammunition in a single ammunition transaction, as specified.
- ✓ **SB 1287 (McGuire) – Fishing** – (1) Expands the authority of DFW to order the closure of any waters or restricting the taking of any species of fish if state health agencies determine that the fish is likely to pose a human health risk from high levels of toxins, requires the Director to notify the FGC and request that FGC schedule a public discussion at its next scheduled full meeting, and exempts a closure or restriction from the Administrative Procedure Act (APA); (2) Requires DFW to issue a waiver from the biennial crab trap tag fee to a participant who is unable to fish due to mandatory military service, and authorize a vessel to transit state waters with Dungeness crab traps that are not marked in the above-described manner if the traps contain either valid Oregon or Washington tags, no crab is onboard the vessel, and the traps are not deployed in state waters; (3) Limits the 30-day start prohibition to a situation in which a person uses the same vessel that was used to take Dungeness crab in specified waters before the delayed opening of the season in the areas subject to the prohibition; and, (4) Requires DFW to establish a gear retrieval permit program and fee.
- ✓ **SB 1363 (Monning) – OPC: Ocean Acidification and Hypoxia Reduction Program** Requires OPC, in consultation with the State Coastal Conservancy and other relevant entities, to establish and administer the Ocean Acidification and Hypoxia Reduction Program for the purposes of achieving specified goals. The bill would authorize moneys in the trust fund to be expended for grants or loans for projects or activities that further public purposes consistent with the Ocean Acidification and Hypoxia Reduction Program.
- ✓ **SB 1473 (Committee on Natural Resources) Fish and Game Commission procedures** – Clarifies that APA procedures apply generally to any FGC regulation that governs the take or possession of any bird, mammal, fish, amphibian, or reptile, except as provided. The bill would conform certain FGC rulemaking procedures to the rulemaking procedures of the Administrative Procedure Act. The bill would delete obsolete and superfluous provisions, make organizational changes, delete obsolete cross references, and make other conforming changes.

The bill would provide that the Sustainable Environmental Protection Act only applies if the lead agency or project applicant has agreed to provide to the public in a readily accessible electronic format an annual compliance report prepared pursuant to the mitigation monitoring and reporting program. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

[SB 457](#) (Nielsen R) Bobcat Protection Act of 2013.

Summary: The Bobcat Protection Act of 2013 requires the Fish and Game Commission to delineate the boundaries of an area in which bobcat trapping is prohibited pursuant to specified provisions using readily identifiable features, such as highways or other major roads, such as those delineated for Joshua Tree National Park. This bill would provide that these features may include roads instead of major roads and would provide that landmarks and geographic positions established by navigation and surveying methods may be used to delineate the boundaries of an area described above in which bobcat trapping is prohibited.

[SB 615](#) (Berryhill R) Waste discharge requirements: waivers: managed wetlands.

Summary: Would require that managed wetlands be presumed to not pose a significant threat to water quality and would require, with respect to managed wetlands, the state board and regional boards to waive the above-described reporting requirements, regional board prescribed waste discharge requirements, and monitoring requirements of the waiver program, except that the state board or a regional board shall require water quality monitoring of a managed wetland not more than once during the duration of each waiver period unless results of downstream monitoring demonstrate a violation of water quality discharge standards. The bill would limit this monitoring to contaminants that are actually applied by wetland managers to the wetland and contaminants that are known to be naturally present in the wetland environment.

Summary: Would authorize the administrator for oil spill response, upon making a specified finding, to loan moneys from the Oil Spill Response Trust Fund to the Hazardous Materials Response and Restoration Subaccount in an amount, not exceeding \$500,000 annually, necessary to reimburse organizations providing wildlife rescue and rehabilitation services for expenses incurred by rescue and rehabilitation operations for wildlife injured by spill events of nonoil materials, thereby making an appropriation. The bill would prohibit the administrator from making a loan if the total amount of moneys made from these loans that has not been repaid exceeds \$2,500,000.

Summary: Current law imposes requirements on the Department of Water Resources in connection with the preparation of a Bay Delta Conservation Plan. This bill would state the intent of the Legislature to enact legislation establishing judicial review procedures for the Bay Delta Conservation Plan.

SB 788

(McGuire D) California Coastal Protection Act of 2015.

Summary: The California Coastal Sanctuary Act of 1994 authorizes the State Lands Commission to enter into a lease for the extraction of oil or gas from state-owned tide and submerged lands in the California Coastal Sanctuary if the commission determines that the oil or gas deposits are being drained by means of producing wells upon adjacent federal lands and the lease is in the best interest of the state. This bill would enact the California Coastal Protection Act of 2015, which would delete this authorization. The bill would make related legislative findings and declarations.

(Committee on Budget and Fiscal Review) State government.

Summary: Would, among other things, change the name of the Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act, the Bureau of Medical Marijuana Regulation, and the Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act Fund to the Medical Cannabis Regulation and Safety Act, the Bureau of Medical Cannabis Regulation, and the Medical Cannabis Regulation and Safety Act Fund, and would change references to medical marijuana or marijuana to medical cannabis or cannabis, respectively. The bill would authorize licensing authorities, as defined, to adopt rules and regulations to carry out the purposes of that act and emergency regulations, as specified.

SB 839

(Committee on Budget and Fiscal Review) Public resources.

Introduced: 1/7/2016

Last Amend: 6/14/2016

Status: 9/13/2016-Chaptered by Secretary of State - Chapter 340, Statutes of 2016.

Location: 9/13/2016-S. CHAPTERED

Summary: Current law prohibits an entity from substantially diverting or obstructing the natural flow of, or substantially changing or using any material from the bed, channel, or bank of, any river, stream, or lake, or from depositing certain material where it may pass into any river, stream, or lake designated by the Department of Fish and Wildlife, without first notifying the department of that activity, and entering into a lake or streambed alteration agreement if required by the department to protect fish and wildlife resources. This bill would make it unlawful for any entity to violate those provisions, thereby imposing a state-mandated local program by changing the definition of a crime. The bill would subject to that civil

penalty any entity that violates those provisions.

(Committee on Budget and Fiscal Review) Oil spills.

Summary: The Lempert-Keene-Seastrand Oil Spill Prevention and Response Act makes a person who causes or permits a spill or inland spill strictly liable for specified penalties for the spill on a per-gallon-released basis. This bill would reduce the amount of penalty by the amount of released oil that is recovered and properly disposed of. The bill would require the administrator for oil spill response to adopt regulations governing the method for determining the amount of oil that is recovered and properly disposed of. This bill contains other related provisions.

(Committee on Budget and Fiscal Review) Public resources: greenhouse gas emissions and biomass.

Summary: The Cannella Environmental Farming Act of 1995 requires the Secretary of Food and Agriculture to convene a 5-member Scientific Advisory Panel on Environmental Farming, as prescribed, for the purpose of providing advice and assistance to federal, state, and local government agencies on issues relating to air, water, and wildlife habitat, as specified. Current law authorizes the panel to establish ad hoc committees to assist the panel in performing its functions. This bill would increase the number of members on the panel from 5 to 9 members and would require that the secretary appoint 5 instead of 3 of these members, the Secretary for Environmental Protection appoint 2 instead of one of these members, and the Secretary of the Natural Resources Agency appoint 2 instead of one of these members, as prescribed.

(Jackson D) State Remote Piloted Aircraft Act.

The bill would authorize the Department of Transportation to adopt rules and regulations governing the conditions under which remote piloted aircraft may be operated for the purpose of protecting and ensuring the general public interest and safety and the safety of persons operating remote piloted aircraft.

The bill, on and after January 1, 2018, unless a specified initiative is passed by the voters at the November 8, 2016, statewide general election, would impose a fee on the consumption or other use in this state of medical marijuana purchased from any retailer for the consumption or other use in this state at the rate of 10% of the sales price of the medical marijuana.

SB 1020 **(Wieckowski D) Land use: mitigation lands.**

Status: 7/1/2016-Failed Deadline pursuant to Joint Rule 61(b)(13). (Last location was L. GOV. on 5/27/2016)

Location: 7/1/2016-A. DEAD

Summary: Current law authorizes a state or local agency that, in the development of its own project is required to protect property in order to mitigate an adverse impact upon natural resources, to take any action that the agency deems necessary to meet its mitigation obligations. This bill would authorize a regional park district, regional park and open-space district, and regional open-space district to meet the mitigation obligation by possessing budget reserves in excess of funds required to, among other things, meet the mitigation obligation and retain permanent stewardship and maintenance staff to manage the resource.

SB 1026 **(Nielsen R) Department of Fish and Wildlife: lake or streambed alteration agreements.**

Introduced: 2/12/2016

Status: 4/22/2016-Failed Deadline pursuant to Joint Rule 61(b)(5). (Last location was S. N.R. & W. on 4/12/2016)

Location: 4/22/2016-S. DEAD

Summary: Current law prohibits an entity from substantially diverting or obstructing the natural flow of, or substantially changing or using any material from the bed, channel, or bank of, any river, stream, or lake, or from depositing certain material where it may pass into any river, stream, or lake, without first notifying the Department of Fish and Wildlife of that activity, and entering into a lake or streambed alteration agreement if required by the department to protect fish and wildlife resources. This bill would limit the diversions and obstructions governed by these alteration agreement requirements to the diversions and obstructions that alter the bed, channel, or bank of a river, stream, or lake.

SB 1062 **(Lara D) Elephants: prohibited treatment.**

Last Amend: 6/15/2016

Status: 8/29/2016-Chaptered by Secretary of State - Chapter 234, Statutes of 2016.

Location: 8/29/2016-S. CHAPTERED

Summary: Would, beginning January 1, 2018, prohibit any person who houses, possesses, or is in direct contact with an elephant from using, or authorizing or allowing an employee, agent, or contractor to use, a bullhook, ankus, baseball bat, axe handle, pitchfork, or other device designed to inflict pain for the purpose of training or controlling the behavior of an elephant. A person who violates these provisions would not be subject to criminal penalty but would be subject to civil penalties and the restricted species permit for the elephant would be subject to immediate suspension or revocation by the Department of Fish and Wildlife.

SB 1081 **(Morrell R) Hunting and sport fishing: free and reduced license fees: veterans.**

Last Amend: 3/28/2016

Status: 5/27/2016-Failed Deadline pursuant to Joint Rule 61(b)(8). (Last location was APPR. SUSPENSE FILE on 4/11/2016)

Location: 5/27/2016-S. DEAD

Summary: Would require the Department of Fish and Wildlife to issue a free hunting license, upon application to the department, to a disabled veteran or recovering service member and would require the department, to issue a reduced fee hunting license, upon application and payment of a fee of \$5, to a veteran of the Armed Forces of the United States who was honorably discharged. The bill would prohibit the reduced hunting license fee from being adjusted pursuant to the specified index. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

SB 1083 **(Allen D) California oil spill contingency plan.**

Introduced: 2/17/2016

Last Amend: 4/28/2016

Status: 5/27/2016-Failed Deadline pursuant to Joint Rule 61(b)(8). (Last location was APPR. SUSPENSE FILE on 5/16/2016)

Location: 5/27/2016-S. DEAD

Summary: Current law directs the Governor to require the administrator for oil spill response to amend, not in conflict with the National Contingency Plan, the California oil spill contingency plan to provide for the best achievable protection of waters of the state and to include specified elements. This bill would require a communications element, as specified, to be developed by the administrator and included in the California oil spill contingency plan.

SB 1089 **(Pavley D) Wildlife Conservation Board.**

Introduced: 2/17/2016

Last Amend: 8/4/2016

Status: 9/22/2016-Chaptered by Secretary of State - Chapter 481, Statutes of 2016.

Location: 9/22/2016-S. CHAPTERED

Summary: Would expand the composition of the Wildlife Conservation Board to include 4 public members to serve terms of 4 years each and would require one public member to be appointed by the Speaker of the Assembly, one public member to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules, and 2 public members to be appointed by the Governor. This bill would require the public members appointed to the board to have demonstrated interest and expertise in land acquisition for conservation purposes.

SB 1114 **(Allen D) Commercial fishing: swordfish.**

Introduced: 2/17/2016

Last Amend: 5/11/2016

Status: 5/27/2016-Failed Deadline pursuant to Joint Rule 61(b)(8). (Last location was APPR. SUSPENSE FILE on 5/16/2016)

Location: 5/27/2016-S. DEAD

Summary: Would prohibit the Department of Fish and Wildlife from issuing any drift gill net permit. The bill would require the department to revoke all latent drift gill net permits, as defined, within 12 months of a federal authorization to use deep set buoy gear or similar gear to take swordfish and would require the department to revoke all drift gill net permits if the department has not been notified of any landings under any drift gill net permit during any 2 successive fishing seasons.

SB 1188 **(McGuire D) Wildlife management areas: payment of taxes and assessments.**

Introduced: 2/18/2016

Status: 9/30/2016-Vetoed by the Governor

Location: 9/30/2016-S. VETOED

Summary: Current law regulates real property acquired and operated by the state as wildlife

management areas, and authorizes the Department of Fish and Wildlife, when income is directly derived from that real property, as provided, to annually pay to the county in which the property is located an amount equal to the county taxes levied upon the property at the time it was transferred to the state. This bill would require, instead of authorize, the department to make these payments subject to appropriation by the Legislature.

SB 1191 **(Berryhill R) Fish and wildlife: management plans.**

Last Amend: 4/5/2016

Status: 4/22/2016-Failed Deadline pursuant to Joint Rule 61(b)(5). (Last location was S. N.R. & W. on 4/5/2016)

Location: 4/22/2016-S. DEAD

Summary: Current law authorizes regulations that the Fish and Game Commission adopts to implement a fishery management plan or plan amendment for that fishery to make inoperative, in regard to that fishery, any fishery management statute that applies to that fishery. This bill would establish a similar process for the management of wildlife resources on land and the inland waters of the state.

SB 1235 **(De León D) Ammunition.**

Introduced: 2/18/2016

Last Amend: 6/22/2016

Status: 7/1/2016-Chaptered by Secretary of State - Chapter No. 55, Statutes of 2016

Location: 7/1/2016-S. CHAPTERED

Summary: Would, if the Safety for All Act of 2016 is enacted by the voters at the November 8, 2016, statewide general election, amend the act to instead allow ammunition to be sold only to a person whose information matches an entry in the Automated Firearms System and who is eligible to possess ammunition, to a person who has a current certificate of eligibility issued by the department, or to a person who purchases or transfers the ammunition in a single ammunition transaction, as specified. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

SB 1243 **(Berryhill R) Sport fishing: licenses.**

Introduced: 2/18/2016

Status: 5/6/2016-Failed Deadline pursuant to Joint Rule 61(b)(6). (Last location was RLS. on 3/3/2016)

Location: 5/6/2016-S. DEAD

Summary: Current law requires a resident or a nonresident, 16 years of age or older, upon payment of a specified fee, to be issued a sport fishing license for a prescribed period. Current law requires the Fish and Game Commission to adjust the amount of the sport fishing license fees, as prescribed, to fully recover, but not exceed, all reasonable administrative and implementation costs of the Department of Fish and Wildlife and the Fish and Game Commission relating to those licenses. This bill would make nonsubstantive changes to these provisions.

SB 1286 **(Leno D) Peace officers: records of misconduct.**

Introduced: 2/19/2016

Last Amend: 4/21/2016

Status: 5/27/2016-Failed Deadline pursuant to Joint Rule 61(b)(8). (Last location was APPR. SUSPENSE FILE on 5/9/2016)

Location: 5/27/2016-S. DEAD

Summary: Current law requires a department or agency that employs peace officers to establish a procedure to investigate complaints by members of the public against those officers. Current law authorizes a department or agency that employs custodial officers to establish a similar procedure for its officers. Existing law requires the department or agency to provide written notification to the complaining party of the disposition of a complaint made pursuant to those provisions within 30 days of the disposition. This bill would require that notification to include, at a minimum, the charges framed in

response to the complaint, the agency's disposition with respect to each of those charges, any factual findings on which the agency based its dispositions, and any discipline imposed or corrective action taken.

[SB 1287](#) (McGuire D) Fishing.

Introduced: 2/19/2016

Last Amend: 8/18/2016

Status: 9/23/2016-Chaptered by Secretary of State - Chapter 542, Statutes of 2016.

Location: 9/23/2016-S. CHAPTERED

Summary: Current law authorizes the Director of Fish and Wildlife to order the closure of any waters or otherwise restrict the taking under a commercial fishing license in state waters of species of fish if the Director of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment, in consultation with the State Public Health Officer, determines that the species or subspecies of fish is likely to pose a human health risk from high levels of toxic substances. The closure or restriction is required to be adopted by emergency regulation, as specified. Under current law, any violation of the Fish and Game Code, or of any rule, regulation, or order made or adopted under the code, is generally a misdemeanor. This bill would expand this authority to all fishing.

[SB 1386](#) (Wolk D) Resource conservation: working and natural lands.

Introduced: 2/19/2016

Last Amend: 8/1/2016

Status: 9/23/2016-Chaptered by Secretary of State - Chapter 545, Statutes of 2016.

Location: 9/23/2016-S. CHAPTERED

Summary: Would declare it to be the policy of the state that the protection and management of natural and working lands, as defined, is an important strategy in meeting the state's greenhouse gas reduction goals, and would require all state agencies, departments, boards, and commissions to consider this policy when revising, adopting, or establishing policies, regulations, expenditures, or grant criteria relating to the protection and management of natural and working lands.

[SB 1396](#) (Wolk D) Wildlife Conservation Board: Inner Coast Range Program.

Introduced: 2/19/2016

Last Amend: 5/31/2016

Status: 7/1/2016-Failed Deadline pursuant to Joint Rule 61(b)(13). (Last location was W., P. & W. on 6/9/2016)

Location: 7/1/2016-A. DEAD

Summary: Would establish the Inner Coast Range Program with specified goal areas and authorization related to the Inner Coast Range Region, as defined. This bill would require the Wildlife Conservation Board to establish an advisory board for the program consisting of one representative of each of the counties within the region and would authorize the board to invite certain legislators and representatives of state and federal agencies to participate as members on the advisory board.

[SB 1416](#) (Stone R) Voluntary contribution: Revive the Salton Sea Fund.

Introduced: 2/19/2016

Last Amend: 6/15/2016

Status: 8/26/2016-Chaptered by Secretary of State - Chapter No. 219, Statutes of 2016

Location: 8/26/2016-S. CHAPTERED

Summary: Would allow an individual to designate on his or her tax return that a specified amount in excess of his or her tax liability be transferred to the Revive the Salton Sea Fund, which would be created by this bill. The bill would prohibit a voluntary contribution designation for the Revive the Salton Sea Fund from being added on the tax return until another voluntary contribution designation is removed or a space is available and would require, once the designation is added, specified information to be on the tax form, including the purposes for which the contribution would be used. This bill contains other related provisions.

SB 1447 (Morrell R) Peace officers.

Introduced: 2/19/2016

Status: 5/6/2016-Failed Deadline pursuant to Joint Rule 61(b)(6). (Last location was RLS. on 3/10/2016)

Location: 5/6/2016-S. DEAD

Summary: Current law establishes which persons are included and excluded within the definition of peace officers. Current law provides that specified fire department, fire protection agency, and military personnel are peace officers. This bill would make a technical, nonsubstantive change to that provision.

SB 1473 (Committee on Natural Resources and Water) Natural resources.

Introduced: 2/29/2016

Last Amend: 8/11/2016

Status: 9/23/2016-Chaptered by Secretary of State - Chapter 546, Statutes of 2016.

Location: 9/23/2016-S. CHAPTERED

Summary: The California Constitution provides for the delegation to the Fish and Game Commission of powers relating to the protection and propagation of fish and game. Current statutory law delegates to the commission the power to regulate the taking or possession of birds, mammals, fish, amphibians, and reptiles, except as provided. Current law establishes procedures that are specific to regulations adopted by the commission pursuant to this authority. This bill would clarify that those procedures apply generally to any commission regulation that governs the take or possession of any bird, mammal, fish, amphibian, or reptile, except as provided.

SBX1 1 (Beall D) Transportation funding.

Introduced: 6/22/2015

Last Amend: 8/29/2016

Status: 8/29/2016-From committee with author's amendments. Read second time and amended. Re-referred to Com. on APPR.

Location: 8/29/2016-S. APPR.

Summary: Would create the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Program to address deferred maintenance on the state highway system and the local street and road system. The bill would require the California Transportation Commission to adopt performance criteria, consistent with a specified asset management plan, to ensure efficient use of certain funds available for the program.
